The Pastor presided, and opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes of the meetings of March 21, April 4 and April 18, 1937, were read and approved.

Brother Steelberg stated that a meeting of the Board had been called in June with reference to the continuance of the radio broadcast. After considerable discussion the members of the Board of Trustees who were present, 3 in number, felt that with the expected assent of the other members of the Board, they would give us a reprieve and permit us to operate for two more weeks provided the funds came in.

Brother Zell made a statement that while the total offerings for 1937 were greater in comparison to the same period in 1936, yet the general offerings had been less, owing to the fact that we have the Radio Fund this year. He also stated that the last three Sundays money had come in for the radio broadcast, with a little surplus.

After quite a considerable discussion pro and con with reference to the radio broadcast, it was moved by Brother Nethery, seconded by Brother Hollahan, and carried, that a secret ballot be taken as to whether we should continue on the air or take a vacation.

The result of the ballot was that we would take a vacation. (8 to continue on the air, 9 to take vacation.)

Brother Bell brought up a question concerning cottage prayer meetings, suggesting that he felt it would be good to have moveable cottage prayer meetings, in different sections of the city, each week, for the winter months, as the street meetings close.

After some discussion it was moved by Brother Zell, seconded by Brother Day, that the matter of the cottage prayer meetings be referred to the Pastor and Board of Elders.

Brother Spain asked whether the Pastor had given any thought to putting on a night for regular prayer meetings, or tarrying meetings at the church.

After some discussion, there being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
