OFFICIAL BOARD

Minutes of the meeting of the Official Board held at the Church on Sunday evening, July 17, 1938, after the evening service.

The meeting was opened with prayer.

Brother Steelberg stated that he had felt led to look into the matter of the radio the past week, and had called the meeting to report his findings:

The rates on WPEN (which has been made a stronger station, and it may still be increased in the fall),

Saturday, nothing open.

Wednesday evening, 1/2 hr, between 9 and 10	\$54.40
" " 1 hr. between 9 and 10	\$88.00

WIP, nothing available on Saturday until after 12 midnight	
Evening rates, 1/2 hr. (less 15% to the Church)	\$148.50
Day rates, 1/2 hour (less 15% to the Church)	\$ 74.25
Day rates, 1 hour " " "	\$117.25
Night rate, 1 hour " " "	\$234.50

After discussion with reference to the day and evening rates, the different stations, etc., and also with reference to the announcement over the air with regard to offerings, and, the fact that it was necessary for the whole Board to be in unity,

A motion was made by Brother Combs "That if the Official Board stand together as one man behind the radio proposition, that

we contract for one hour on the air, and trust God to send in the money over the air, or in any other way, to support the work, according to the provisions in our Manual. This motion was seconded by Brother Herbert McKittrick, and was unanimously carried by a rising vote of those present.

(A Trustee's meeting is to be held on Monday night, July 18, at which time it is expected to ascertain from the Trustees who were not at the Official Board meeting, their stand in the radio matter.) (Unanimously approved by all members of the Trustee Board.)

On motion duly made and seconded, the meeting adjourned with prayer.
