Recently it has come to our attention that a rumour is circulating among some of our members concerning a certain ballot cast in our recent Annual Election of Officers.

Lest there be any misunderstanding and satan should get an advantage of us I feel it would be well to make a statement concerning the same.

A few days before the recent Election one of our members inquired if it would be permissible to mark a Ballot to be cast on the night of the election stating that stating that they could not be present at the election due to employment, and they feared that if they asked to be excused they might lose their position.
