The meeting was opened with prayer.

The Pastor read some proposed amendments to the Manual that are to be passed on at the next quarterly business meeting, which proposed amendments will be read at a special meeting of the Church on Tuesday evening, April 4, 1939, and announcements made thereof according to the Manual.

The Pastor also stated that Brother Earl Bell desired a letter of dismissal from the Church, and that Mrs. String (formerly Evelyn Bell) desired her Church letter so that she might join Brother Schock's Assembly in ^South Philadelphia. These matters will be brought before the ^Church at its next quarterly business meeting on April 17th.

The Pastor also stated that he had received a letter from Brother Christy, of Norristown, asking if it would be possible for them to rent Highway's tent in the latter part of June. This tent was almost completely demolished by a stormin 1938 before it could be taken down, and is unfit for use.

The subject of tent meeting work and also branch work was discussed, mention being made by the Pastor of a work in Darby of which he was apprised by Brother Griffin; the work Brother Tuttle has been assisting in Manayunk, and the cottage meetings that have been held at Brother Marshall's in May Fair.

On motion of Brother Krause, seconded by Brother Combs, and carried, the Pastor is to appoint a Committee to investigate the matter of branch work and tent meeting work, and various extension works, and report to the Board.

The Pastor read a letter from Brother Alfred Williams in which he asked if Highway could help them out in their support in the work they are doing in Washington among the children.

It was the concensus of opinion that Highway was not in a financial condition to help in their support at this time, and the Pastor will so notify them.

The meeting adjourned with prayer.
