The Pastor presided.

The Pastor presented the question of Sister Minnie Baehr's condition, re sending for money for coal, receiving check from Vogler to go to Pinellas Park Home, and her letters saying she was remaining there for the time being, and suggested that it might be well to send two brethren to personally investigate her condition, and that he would be willing to be one df them.

Bro.Robert Lafferty gave a summary and his findings when he visited Sister Baehr about six weeks ago.

Sis.Payne stated that as Bro.Vogler had sent a check for her fare to Pinellas Park, and Springfield having taken the matter in hand, it would be very confusing for us to attempt to do anything, as we were already in the dark concerning the matter.

The Pastor presented the question of Bro.A.Perna's position, stating that he had received a letter from Bro.Perkin saying he should come home; one from Kinderman saying there is a new field opened and Perna would like to remain. However, the cost to get their son, Sonny back to them on the field would cost \$200, which Perna had suggested could be taken out of his support.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, it was agreed that Sonny be returned to their parents and that Highway assume the payment of the \$200 transportation.

The Pastor presented the question of the purchase of a property at 1425 Frankford Avenue, offered for \$5,250, that perhaps could be bought for \$5,000, where story hours could be held for the children.

After discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried, that the Board of Trustees look into the question of the property, and the Board of Elders look into the question of the neighborhood.
