

Meeting of the Official Board held Sunday morning,
June 22, 1952, immediately following the worship service.

Brother Krause took the Chair, and Bro. W. Hepworth offered
prayer.

The Chairman reported that Bro. Bragg, before his departure
for England, had handed him a letter from Bro. and Sister Brock,
missionaries, have been appointed to the field of Africa by
the Council, and desired that it should be considered by the
Official Board, the matter of full support or part support.

It was stated by the Treasurer that he felt we were
running pretty close to our commitments, and after some discussion
on motion of Bro. Hollahan, duly seconded, it was resolved that
this matter be tabled until next Sunday, June 29, 1952, in
order to give the Board a chance to think about it, pray over
it, and get a financial statement from the Trustee Board who
are meeting on Tuesday evening, June 24, 1952.

The Chairman also read a letter that Bro. Bragg had
written to Sister Baehr with reference to her support from
Highway, in view of the past circumstances, and asked the Board
as to whether the letter was all right to be written, and sent.

After some consideration, it was, on motion duly made,
seconded and carried,

RESOLVED, that the District Superintendent of that district
should be contacted and requested to give us a full report
as to the work and also Sister Baehr's personal needs, which
report should come to the Official Board.

Bro. O. Schmel brought up the present condition of the
Sunday School, halls and outside of the church being occupied by
persons socially after the Sunday School is dismissed, rather than
entering the main auditorium for the regular service.

There were several suggestions offered, but no real action
taken.

Bro. T. Griffith spoke concerning those who requested
the use of Highway for weddings, and the manner in which pictures
were taken even during the wedding ceremony. It had been talked
over and discussed by the Trustees, and it was felt that a notice
should be printed and given to those making such a request, stating
that pictures could be taken at certain times and in certain places
in the church, but not during the wedding ceremony.

The meeting adjourned with prayer.
