This is why Highway has survived miraculously, through strife, fire, decay, vandalism and harassment "holding forth the Word of Life" (Philippians 2:16) to the pluralism of the city.

Urban ministry is cross-cultural. We have more in common with the Third World than with the typical middle-class churches of America.

There is a need for gifted, called and trained persons to be city missionaries, to work alongside permanent pastors in urban ministry. This is done in mission work abroad, but seldom at home.

Your prayers are needed for Christian college students to hear Nehemiah's call again: "Let us rise up and build ... The God of Heaven, He will prosper us, therefore, we, His servants, will arise and build." (Nehemiah 2:18-20)
