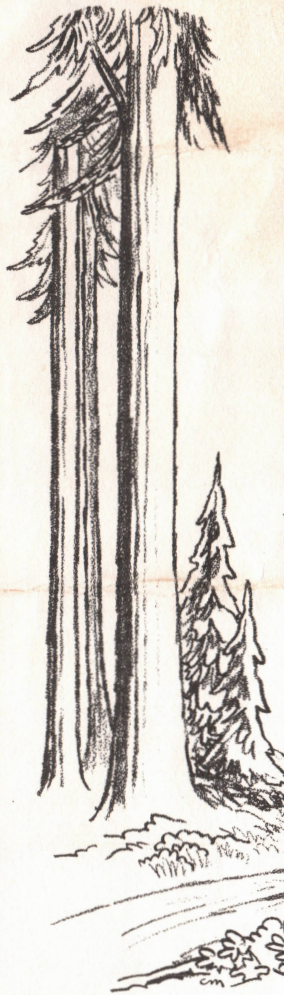


Jesus Is Leading Me Home

For Jesus is leading me Home.*

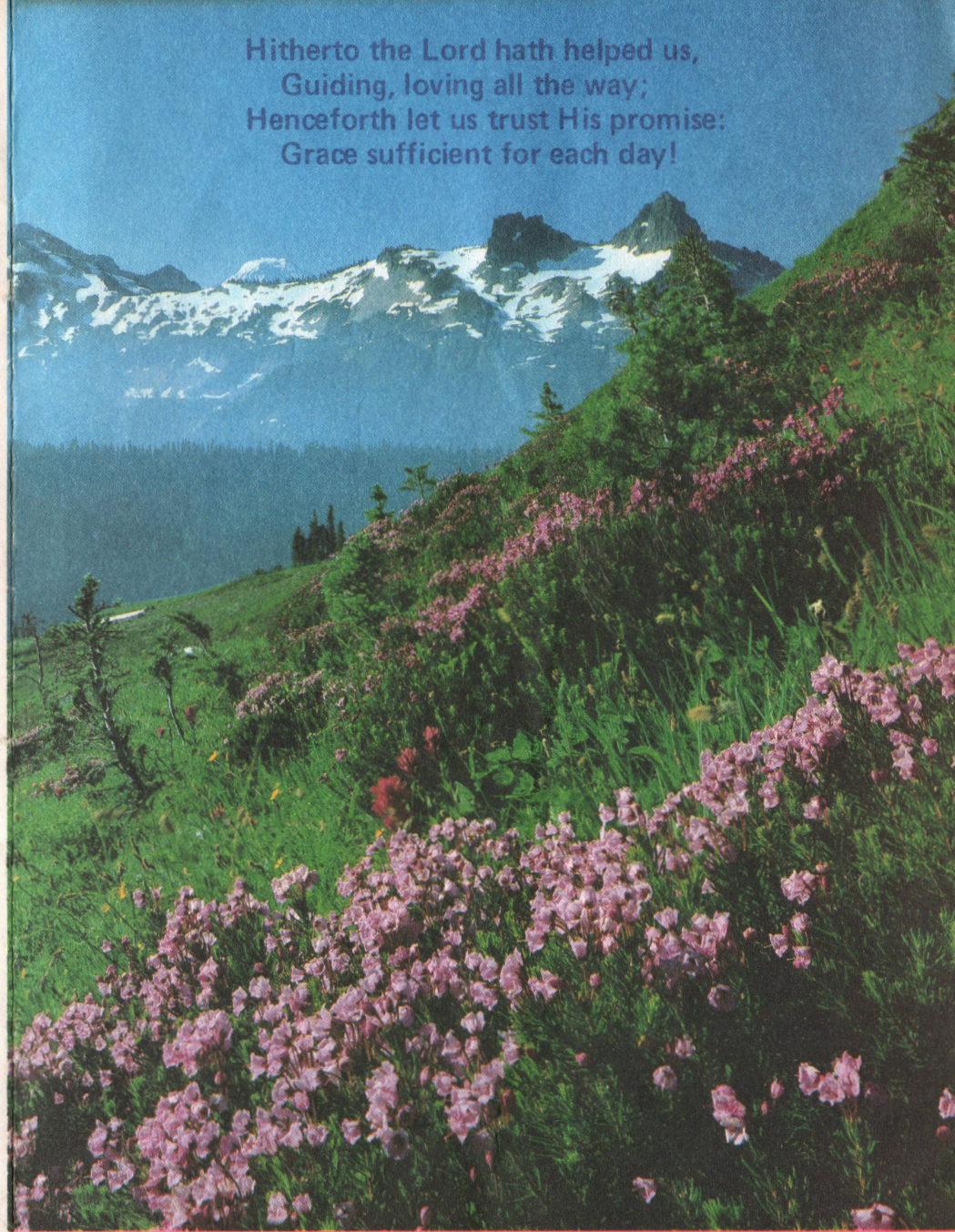
*When I am lonely my Saviour's a Friend,
