"Miracle at Philadelphia"

A major exhibit entitled "Miracle At Philadelphia" which celebrates the 200th anniversary of the Constitution of the United States opened in Independence National Historical Park September 17, to remain throughout the bicentennial year of 1987.

When I read with interest the above statement I pondered the fact that God still wants to perform miracles in Philadelphia.

The night the fire broke out in Highway, I was in the middle of our Bible study speaking about all the miracles in the Word of God. My faith was so exercised that afternoon as I studied.

And now, regardless of all the reverses, I still believe God wants to perform miracles. The greatest miracle I have ever seen or known is the miracle of lives turned from the darkness of sin into the transforming new life upon accepting Jesus as Saviour and Lord.

Today has been designated College Commitment Day in the Assemblies of God. One miracle I long to see is a great spiritual awakening among the college constituency of this city. Revivals are always perpetuated through youth who have their lives to surrender to the purposes of God.

It is hard to imagine a more strategic group to evangelize.

This week some encouraging news came from Valley Forge Christian College of a team of students who want to come and consistently minister in the outreaches of Highway Tabernacle.

Pray the Lord of the harvest that He might send workers to us who desire above all else to see "miracles" in our city of transformed lives. The prayers of William Penn, the founder of this city, are still on deposit. Let's add our prayers, finances and whatever else God asks of us to see "miracles" in this city of Philadelphia.
