Highway Home for the Aged

In the year 1951 Highway Tabernacle sponsored the founding of the Highway Home for the Aged. This had been a matter of much concern to the Church and was discussed as early as 1905, but no action was taken at the time. It had been suggested that a house be purchased near the church and made available to the older folks who were seeking a place of shelter in their sunset years.

God answered our prayers and provided us with a beautiful large home and attractive grounds in Hatfield, Pennsylvania about four miles above Lansdale, Pennsylvania. Today the Home is filled to capacity and after much prayer, it was decided to add a modern wing to the present building, to increase our capacity to 38

guests.

In spite of a tight money situation in the financial field, God opened the way for a \$200,-000 addition which will provide the proper facilities for our aging folks. As of this writing, the new building is approximately 35% complete and it is expected that the new wing will be ready for occupancy by June of 1970.

Highway Home is accredited by the Eastern District Council and the General Council of the Assembly of God. Offerings given to the home are credited under World Ministry giving. At the present time the Home is in charge of Reverend and Mrs. Albert Lazar, acting as Superintendent and Matron. They are assisted by an able staff of workers.
